2. Business

A. Hearing To Solicit Public Comments In Connection With Rezoning Property at 208 South Church, 307 & 309 South Mountain Street from R-6 Residential To A-4 Office, Residential & Institutional To Allow Expansion

Mayor Thompson asked Senior Planner Robby Moody to comment on the rezoning. Mr. Moody states that the Planning Commission received a rezoning request from Union County Carnegie Library. There are three parcels under consideration for rezoning. The applicant requests the rezoning in order to ensure that the current library and future expansion plans are compliant with the Zoning Code. Since the R-6 district does not allow libraries or parking lots as permitted uses, the parking lot is "grandfathered" or non-compliant. They are looking at expanding the library and may need to expand their parking lot. The proposed zoning district is A-4. This zone is established for a compatible mixture of residences, business and professional offices, hospitals, clinics and other institutional uses.
